

# Tiny Goddess Doll Form Pattern

This printed Tiny Goddess template measures approximately 2 1/2 inches tall but can be reduced or enlarged as needed. Once sewn, the blank doll form can be embellished in a number of creative ways to create your own unique art doll. The form can be made from a number of different fabrics depending upon how you plan to embellish the form. For beading, I suggest stuffing the doll as firmly as possible and using quality wool felt, ultra suede or tightly woven cotton as your base fabric. Most quilting fabrics that are 100% cotton or a cotton polyester blend will work nicely or you can also use muslin. If you find the weave of the fabric is a little loose try washing it first in very hot water. In most cases this will shrink the cotton and tighten the weave. If you plan to paint the doll form I suggest using heavy cotton, muslin or thin to medium weight canvas.

**FELT**-To hand sew the doll form of felt or Ultra-Suede, simply trace or pin the pattern directly onto the felt and cut out. With needle and thread, whip stitch around the edge leaving a hole opening for stuffing. Stuff firmly then stitch the hole closed. There is no need to turn the body right side out when done sewing because the stitches are not very noticeable if you use a matching thread or plan cover the seams with beads or other embellish-

**MUSLIN**-To machine sew the doll form of muslin (or other cotton / polyester blend fabric, suggested above), cut out a square of fabric approximately one inch larger than the pattern. Trace pattern onto the fabric. Do not cut out the pattern traced onto fabric until after you've sewn on the traced line. Machine sew along the pattern tracing leaving a hole for stuffing. Cut around your sewn body 1/4 inch away from the seam. Turn right side out, stuff firmly then hand stitch the opening closed.

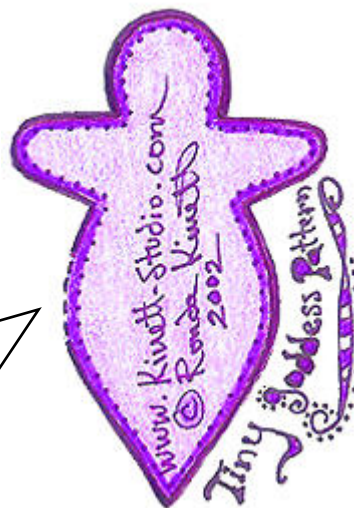

Leave dotted line open for stuffing...



**TIP:** Use a wooden stuffing tool, chopstick or hemostats to firmly push the stuffing into small hard to reach areas.

**TIP:** It's easy to create a template from this pattern that can be used many times. Simply print the pattern on a sheet of sticker paper. Apply the sticker to a piece of paper board (a cereal box works well). Then cut out the pattern and you'll have a template that will survive repeated use.
